Call for Research Papers

The papers should be original and unpublished research. The submitted manuscript should not submit anywhere else for publication.

The submitted manuscripts will be reviewed by the editorial team. The high quality, scientifically robust manuscripts (not previously published and not under consideration for publication in any other Journal) will be considered for publication.

Publication charges

The Research paper will be accepted with a Demand Draft of Rs.1000/- in the name of Principal, IHM, Pusa, New Delhi payable at New Delhi. The Research paper charges will be returned to the author if the paper is not accepted.

Preparation of Manuscript

The basic language of Journal is English; hence manuscript should be prepared in English using “MS Word” with 1 inch margin on all sides (Top, Bottom, Left and Right side) of the page. The preferred font is “Times New Roman”. The font size should be of 12pt, but main sub headings may be of 14pt (Verdana). All plant and microorganism’s scientific names should be written in italic, as suggested by taxonomy. All research articles should be typed 1.5 spacing.

The manuscript should have the following sections:

- Word limit minimum 3000 to maximum 6000 words Manuscript
- Page 1: Title Page, Name(s) of Author(s), Affiliations, Corresponding author
- Page 2: Abstract & Key words
- Page 3: onwards: Introduction, Methodology, Results and Discussion, Conclusion, Acknowledgement (if any),
- Second Last Page: Ethical Issues/approval and Disclaimer.
- Last Page : References (Latest APA Style)

Title Page

The title should appear on a separate page, followed by the author name, institution name and complete address by indicating suitable superscripts.

- The full title of the paper without abbreviations. The title should be as clear, brief and informative as possible, specifying the content of the article. You may suggest alternate short title also.
- Full names of all co-authors and their affiliations should be included in title page.
- Mention corresponding author in asterisk mark (*). Corresponding author contact information (address, telephone-mail).
- Paper Title: CAPITAL LETTERS. 14 point type, Bold (Verdana)
- Author (s): First Letter Capital, 12 point type, Bold (Verdana)
- Affiliation (s): Word case, 10 point type (Times New Roman) Corresponding author has the responsibility to ensure that all co authors are aware and approve the contents of the submitted manuscript.

Abstract

Abstract should be provided on a separate page after the title page. Total size of the abstract should not exceed 200 words. It should represent the total paper by providing objectives, methodology and conclusions very briefly. Abstract should be typed in single-space to distinguish it from the Introduction.

Key Words

The keywords should be provided at the end of the abstract. List 4 to 6 relevant key words after abstract. These should be theme of the paper or most commonly used words.

Introduction

The Introduction is a clear statement of the problem, with relevant background most recent literature on the subject, and the proposed approach or solution. It should be understandable to reviewers from a multi- disciplinary area.

Methodology

The subheads should be included are Research design, Locale, Sample Size and Tools and Technique and Statistical Analysis. The main methods used should be briefly described, citing references. All important materials and equipments (the manufacture's name, if possible), the location of the sample should be provided. New methods or substantially modified methods may be described in sufficient detail. Efforts should be made to mention adaptation or standardization of the methods. The statistical method and the level of significance chosen shall be clearly stated.

Results and Discussion

Results and Discussion should be presented together. The results of the work should be clearly stated and illustrated where necessary by tables and figures. The statistical methods used to analyze data and significance level of the factors should be stated wherever necessary. The interpreted results should be explained clearly in discussions and should relate theme to the existing knowledge in the field as clearly as possible. Table, Graphs, photo and figures (Illustrations) should be inserted at the end of the manuscript and should be appropriately numbered and titled with an explanatory heading. Color photographs and illustrations (line drawings, halftones, photos, photomicrographs etc.) must be clean originals. Those photographs must be clear and sharp. Digital files are recommended for highest quality reproduction and should follow the following guidelines.

- 300dpi or higher sized to fit journal page
- JPEG, GIF, TIFF and PDF formats are preferred
- Acknowledgement (if any)

Conclusion

Concisely summarizes the conclusion of the work and highlight the wider implications. The section should not merely duplicate the abstract.

Acknowledgements

Acknowledgement as well as information regarding funding sources may be provided.

References

Follow the APA style.

Tables

Tables should be type on a separate page and must be numbered with Arabic numerals in the order in which they are cited in the text. They should have a brief descriptive title placed at the top. Footnotes can be included below the table. Table caption should be 12 point Time Roman italic.

Figures

Figures should be on separate pages but not inserted within the text. All figures must be referred to in the text and numbered with Arabic numerals in the sequence in which they are cited. Each figure must be accompanied by legend explaining in detail the contents of the figure and are to be typed under the figures.

Legends /Captions for figures

Text type should be 12 point Times Roman italic (eg; Figure 1 .Caption). A caption should be provided for each figure. The legend should be typed into the manuscript, directly beneath the figure. Legends are to be listed in numerical order, labeled as “Figure 1”, “Figure 2”,etc.

Copyright

Submission of the manuscript represent that the manuscript has not been published previously and is not considered for publication elsewhere. Corresponding author would be required to sign a CRA from (Copy Right Assignment) once the manuscript is accepted which would be sent to the corresponding author’s email. The corresponding author can download the form sign it and can be send as an attachment file through email or by post / courier along with the publication charges.

Ethical Matters

Authors involving in the usage of experimental animals and human subjects in their research article should seek approval from the appropriate Ethical committee in accordance with their research samples. The Method section of the manuscript should include a statement to prove that the investigation was approved and that informed consent was obtained.

Plagiarism
