## 9.0 Application Submission Procedure

Applicants must submit their applications for the Diploma in Bakery & Confectionery or Diploma in Food & Beverage Service, or Diploma in Food Production exclusively via the Institute's official website. The application for admission is to be submitted **online mode through the following link** <https://docs.google.com/forms/d/e/1FAIpQLScE-bcriaVjkjLam6p5BXq7bGkrrExGdNOXbrfVmaHaBMyLbg/viewform?usp=sharing&oid=114127627194875872624> . Candidates must ensure all details are entered in **CAPITAL LETTERS**. Upon successful submission, an automated confirmation will be sent to the applicant's registered email address. **Before initiating the application process**, candidates must keep scanned PDF copies of the following documents ready:

- Passport size photograph (maximum size: 100 MB)
- Own signature (maximum size: 10 MB)
- Class 10<sup>th</sup> mark sheet (maximum size: 100 MB)
- Class 12<sup>th</sup> mark sheets (maximum size: 100 MB)
- Aadhaar card (maximum size: 100 MB)
- Category certificate (if applicable, maximum size: 100 MB)
- EWS certificate (if applicable, maximum size: 100 MB)
- PwD certificate (if applicable, maximum size: 100 MB)
- Receipt of application fee payment (to be made through the institute's "Pay Fee Online" <https://payments.billdesk.com/bdcollect/bd/iohmcanp/6452>). The application fee is ₹800 for General and OBC candidates, and ₹400 for SC, ST, EWS, and PwD candidates.

It is the sole responsibility of the candidate to ensure that they meet all eligibility criteria and fulfill the prescribed admission requirements. If, at any stage—before or after the declaration of merit or during the programme—a candidate is found to be ineligible, their candidature/admission will be cancelled without prior notice. In such cases, disciplinary action may also be taken, and the entire fee paid will be forfeited.

## 11.0 Important Information

**11.1 Admission List-** The merit/selection will be displayed on the Notice Board and website of the Institute i.e., [www.ihmpusa.net](http://www.ihmpusa.net) (Refer important date section-10). Selected candidates are required to pay the fee and complete all formalities as per the schedule displayed in section 10, failing which their candidature may be cancelled and admission will be offered to the next candidate on the wait list.

**11.2 Payment of course fee-** After the appearance of the name on the merit list, the candidates are required to pay the course fee according to Table 4. Payment must be made online via the institute's website using the "Pay Fee Online" (<https://payments.billdesk.com/bdcollect/bd/iohmcamp/6452>). Take the printout of fee paid.

**11.3 Documents** – The following documents needs to be verified with original documents (Kindly see important date section 10).

- Passport size photograph
- 10<sup>th</sup> Marksheet
- 12<sup>th</sup> Marksheet
- Aadhar card
- Caste certificate (if applicable)
- EWS certificate (if applicable)
- PwD certificate (if applicable)
- Three affidavit (Anti-ragging by students, Anti-ragging by parents, Attendance). The format of affidavit should be downloaded from the Institute's website i.e. [www.ihmpusa.net](http://www.ihmpusa.net) (student's section –Affidavits). The affidavits should be on Rs. 20/- stamp paper.
- Medical certificate (Format available on Institute's website i.e. [www.ihmpusa.net](http://www.ihmpusa.net)).

**11.3 Reservation** – Reservation to SC, ST, OBC, PwD, and EWS categories will be as per the Central Government Norms.

- **Physically Disabled Candidates** - Person with Disability (including leprosy cured) as specified by the Government of India.
- **Orthopedically Handicapped Candidates-** Orthopedically Handicapped candidates who have locomotion disability or cerebral palsy with locomotion impairment of a minimum of 40% and a maximum of 75% and fall in the following categories are eligible to apply.
  - **B.L.** - Both legs were affected but not the arms
  - **P.A.** -One arm affected (R or L)/ Impaired reach/ Weakness of grip/ Ataxia
  - **O.L.** -One leg affected (R or L)
  - **M.W.** -Muscular weakness and limited physical endurance.
- **Visually Handicapped Candidates:** Visually handicapped candidates who suffer from any one of the following conditions are eligible to apply. Visual acuity not exceeding 6/60 or 20/200 (swollen) in the better eye with correcting lenses. Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of 20 or worse
- **Hearing Impaired candidates-** Hearing impaired candidates having disabilities between 40% to 75% shall be eligible.

**11.4 Mentally retarded** persons are not covered under the above reservations. However, keeping in mind, the occupational hazards of the courses, the institute will forward their application to team of professional faculty to assess if the student can withstand rigorous practical classes as per his/her interest shown in the particular diploma programme.

**11.5 Refund of fee** – A candidate who has been allotted a seat in the respective course and withdraws till the commencement of classes is eligible to get a refund of 50% of the fee and caution money. No Refund is applicable (except caution money) after commencement of classes whether he/ she attended the classes or not. Caution Fee will be forfeited if not claimed within one year from the date of passing or leaving the course.

## 12.0 Code of Conduct

1. The following acts/items are strictly prohibited within the premises
  - a) Ragging in any form
  - b) Any form of intimidation or violence
  - c) Damage to the furniture, equipment, and fixture of the Institute
  - d) Drunken or disorderly behaviour
  - e) Use or consumption of narcotics or alcoholic beverages
  - f) Gambling
  - g) Smoking
  - h) Use of unauthorized electrical appliances
  - i) Pasting posters, writing on walls, or defacing the hostel in any manner
  - j) Shouting, calling out, whistling, or singing loudly
  - k) Possession of firearms, knives, cycle chains, rods, or any kind of weapons
  - l) Any immoral or unethical activity that may harm the reputation of the Institute
2. Use of audio equipment is not permitted; however, earphones/headphones are allowed.
3. Furniture must not be moved without prior permission.
4. All fans, lights, and other electrical appliances must be switched off when not in use.
5. Pets are not allowed within the premises.
6. Carrying food or beverages outside the dining hall is not permitted.
7. All instructions/duties assigned by the management must be strictly followed.
8. Students must adhere to the grooming, dress code and timings of the institute.
9. Students must maintain a minimum of **75% attendance** in classes.
10. The management reserves the right to revise the “Code of Conduct” from time to time. Changes will be notified through the website or notice boards. Ignorance of rules shall not be accepted.

## 13.0 Punishment

Ignorance of rules will not be accepted. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Discipline Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of violating any code of conduct shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- a) Suspension/ Expulsion from the institute
- b) Monetary fine will be imposed to recover the cost of damaged furniture, equipment, and fixture of the institute.
- c) Collective punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the act against *code of conduct* are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
